

## Adjunct Faculty: Biology (Ref: ADJ-BIO)

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**Summary:** Queens University of Charlotte invites applications for an adjunct faculty instructor position in the Department of Biology, teaching one or more of the following courses: Human Anatomy and Physiology, Microbiology or General Biology for non-majors.

### Experience, Knowledge and Skills Required

Candidates must have a master's degree in Biology or related field; a terminal degree in Biology or the equivalent education and experience is preferred. Excellent oral communication skills, evidence of high-quality teaching effectiveness in undergraduate teaching.

### Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Primary teaching responsibilities will include undergraduate classes in the College of Arts and Sciences. A successful candidate should have a passion for teaching, ability to work with both traditional and non-traditional age students, the ability to connect with students at all levels of proficiency including non-majors and pre-nursing students. The Biology Department offers both day and evening classes in the fall, spring and summer semesters.

### Physical Requirements of the Position *(with or without reasonable accommodation)*

- **Eye-Hand Coordination:** Requires hand-eye coordination and manual dexterity sufficient to operate a computer keyboard, copier, calculator and other office equipment.
- **Talking:** Especially where one must frequently convey detailed or important instructions or ideas accurately, loudly, or quickly.
- **Repetitive Motion:** Movements frequently and regularly required using the wrists, hands, and/or fingers.

- **Average Hearing:** Able to hear average or normal conversations and receive ordinary information.
- **Average Visual Abilities:** Average, ordinary, visual acuity necessary including close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.
- **Physical Strength:** Will regularly be required to sit, use hands to finger, handle or feel objects, tools and controls reach with hands and arms. Must be able to stand, walk, stoop, kneel, or crouch. Must regularly lift and/or move up to 10 pounds, and occasionally lift and/or move up to 20 pounds.

### **Work Conditions**

Work in office and classroom environments, involving contact with students, faculty, staff, parents, service providers and vendors. Work has deadlines, multiple interruptions, moderate volume and may be stressful at times.
