

## New Class Notes Procedures

Queens University of Charlotte is implementing a new Class Notes procedure beginning with the Summer 2004 *Odyssey*. The alumni programs office will send each class reporter a set of labels and Class Notes forms for their classmates. The reporters will then mail the form to their classmates with a personal note requesting information for the Class Notes section of the *Odyssey*. The Class Notes form will allow alumni to send their news and updated information back to their class reporter quickly and easily.

The reporter will then compile the class news and maintain a 100-word limit per alumna/us entry. This will allow more alumni news to be included and maintain a fair basis for all participants.

This more inclusive system will allow all alumni to be able to submit news for class notes, thus increasing our outreach to our alumni base and allowing your class reporter to be more effective in his or her job as a Queens volunteer.

Thank you for your cooperation, and we hope you will agree that our new Class Notes procedure will be more effective in keeping all our alumni engaged in the life of their alma mater!
