Pat Baker probably knows Queens better than anyone. Not only was she a student in Hayworth but also in the College of Arts and Sciences. After that, she became one of the first to graduate in the new masters program for organizational communication in 2001. And just to round things out, she is now part of the Queens faculty, in English and communications. Baker received her undergraduate degree from Queens in 1984. "I started in Hayworth, then quit my job and went full time in CAS for two years to finish. My majors were business and English," says Baker. "Any class with Dr. Charles Hadley or Dr. Richard Goode was fantastic"

## Wayne Smith '98

Wayne Smith has been on an amazing journey since graduating from Queens University of Charlotte in 1998. He has held exciting positions in the business world and is currently working toward his MBA at Harvard Business School. And, he says, his time at Queens is what started it all. "The Queens

experience has been the solid foundation on which I have been able to further my professional career," he says.

President of the Mortar Board Society, a member of Students in Free Enterprise and the Model United Nations Team and a business major, Smith gained critical skills in writing, critical thinking and communication at Queens. "We were required to learn – even sometimes painstakingly – to be good writers. The writing skills I developed at Queens have helped me excel both at work and in graduate school." Smith adds that the diversity of teaching methods at Queens, ranging from lectures, class discussions, films, performances and hands-on experiences, engages students and ensures they get the most out of each topic. "Being able to take one side of an issue and defend it within the classroom is very similar to presenting your annual plans in a management meeting or handling a cold call in a Harvard Business School class."

His favorite professors at Queens were Dr. Norris Frederick, who taught Smith's Core class, and Dr. Timothy Burson, who taught Smith's numerous courses in economics and finance. "Dr. Frederick's teaching style and passion for teaching were amazing, and Dr. Burson's command of the material and ability to communicate concepts were remarkable," Smith says.

Smith credits his internship at Queens with being his most influential experience as an undergraduate. "I had the opportunity to intern for Bank of America in London," he says. "That experience significantly shaped my career. Internships give students the opportunity to interact in a professional environment of their choice. These interactions facilitate learning skills that cannot be gained in any classroom: communications skills, networking and professional responsibility."

Smith went on to work for Accenture in 1998, then known as Anderson Consulting. In 2000, he accepted a management position with McMaster-Carr Supply Company in New Jersey. While there he held management positions in marketing and warehouse operations and led a group of four supervisors and 50 staff members.

While Smith's post-Harvard plans are still up in the air, his ultimate goal is to lead turnarounds for failing companies. He says, "I'm still deciding whether to pursue more industry experience, enter the field via the private equity arena or simply jump in and look for a turnaround opportunity right away."
