



Associate of Science in Nursing

The Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) at Queens University of Charlotte prepares individuals with the essential knowledge and skills to become competent beginning practitioners, able to meet the nursing care needs of a culturally diverse society, primarily in hospital settings. The curriculum is designed to facilitate the student's educational needs and professional development, while incorporating and building on the humanities, social, behavioral and natural sciences. The program enrolls new students in both Fall and Spring, and requires 21 to 24 months to complete.

Admission Criteria

- Graduation from an accredited high school or the equivalent
- A 2.5 cumulative GPA on all recent college work and any required courses already completed

Applicants without prior college work are considered based on their high school record, especially the quality and amount of college-preparatory work; recommendations from the secondary school; and satisfactory scores on the SAT Reasoning Test or the American College Test (ACT).

A total of 71 credit hours of work is required to complete the ASN Program. Courses are listed by the Queens University of Charlotte designated name. The transfer of general education courses must be approved by the office of the Registrar at Queens University of Charlotte. Transcripts of previous college level work will be evaluated by the Registrar after all college transcripts have been received and upon formal application to the program.
