Student Completion

The IAD program serves multiple students in traditional and post-traditional capacity. The following five-year aggregate student data was collected using institutional records.

- Full-time traditional undergraduate students: 4 years
- Full-time traditional and post-traditional *transfer* students: 2.89 years*
- Full-time post-traditional *second-degree* students: 2.79 years*

*data based on mix of previous 42-credit curriculum and current 68-credit curriculum. Refer to the current Bachelor of Arts in Interior Architecture and Design curriculum one-sheet for degree requirements and sequence options.

Student Retention and Attrition

The IAD program requires no portfolio or previous academic experience in art or design to be enrolled and maintains a Minimum Grade Requirement policy for core curriculum courses. The following three-year aggregate student data was collected using institutional records.

- *70% of students who completed their first semester in the major return the following year, putting first to second-year attrition at 30%. 94% of students who complete their second year finish their degree, putting second to fourth year attrition at 6%.*

Acceptance into Graduate Programs:

Based on self-reported survey and social network profile review, no alumni indicated they applied or graduated from a graduate program.

Job Placement Rates:

Of the last three graduating years, 91% of alumni status (including 2019 graduates) could be verified via self-reported survey or social network profile review, of those:

- 80% indicate they are employed.
- 60% indicate they work in the design-build industry.
