Queens/Elon Merger Update

Elon University and Queens University of Charlotte have established a joint Integration Team to guide the next phase of their planned merger, following the signing of a definitive legal agreement approved by both boards of trustees. Co-chaired by Elon Chief Integration Officer and Executive Vice President Jeff Stein and Queens President Emerita Pamela Davies, the team includes academic, administrative, and operational leaders from both institutions and is responsible for meeting near-term regulatory and accreditation milestones in 2026, developing sustainable shared services, and laying the groundwork for long-term collaboration.



Organized across core functional areas and guided by principles focused on student impact, financial sustainability, and institutional excellence, the team will meet regularly to coordinate progress and engage campus communities. In a recent meeting with fellow Noble Fellows, Dr. Davies shared her insights on the rationale for the merger and responded to questions regarding next steps and long-term goals. Stay up to date.
