You will receive 3.0 credit hours *each semester* as **BUSN 492, PSYC 375**, or an internship for 2.0 credit hours (**INT 401 or 402**). *Class times will be modified to reflect 3.0 credit hours (with start times of 9:30-10:30 am and 12:00-1:00 pm, for example). Class section assignment will be based on the needs of the T2U program, although your personal preference & request will be considered and accommodated if possible.

If selected, you must commit **for both semesters (Fall & Spring semesters)** in order to participate in this year-long practicum experience. Please review your major's courses requirements and typical class meeting times when considering your availability to fully participate in this program. In addition, you must participate in each class meeting to receive full credit for the course. While the expectation is that you commit to the position for an entire year, a mid-year review will occur to evaluate fall semester performance and determine acceptability to continue as a leader in the spring semester.

We will contact you directly if you are selected for an interview. Interviews will be scheduled in April 2023. Highly interested applicants who would like early consideration should turn in a completed application by **Friday, March 24th**.
