
We're living in dire times. People don't know their neighbors. We disregard someone's entire personhood based on a single political view. Individualism often supplants social responsibility when it matters most. At the center of our many societal ills, David Brooks argues, is the fact that we simply don't treat each other well. We've forgotten how to connect with one another on a human level. Fortunately, these skills are learnable and have far-reaching effects, from healing personal and familial relationships to making you a more effective leader and strengthening business impact. Based on his bestselling book, "How to Know a Person," this talk is ultimately a guide to becoming a better person, living a more connected and fulfilling life, and repairing our torn social fabric.



#### Moderated by Anna Quindlen:

Anna Quindlen is a prolific bestselling author, Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist, and

social critic. She is renowned for her nationally syndicated columns offering insightful and reflective commentary on social and political issues ranging from gender equality to current events that speak to readers directly and help them make sense of their lives.



#### **About David Brooks:**

David Brooks is a bestselling author, op-ed columnist at the New York Times, and recurring commentator on PBS NewsHour. He has a gift for bringing readers and audiences face-to-face with the spirit of our times with humor, insight, and quiet passion. He is a keen observer of the American way of life and a savvy analyst of present-day politics and foreign affairs whose columns are among the most read in the nation.

His latest release, "How to Know a Person: The Art of Seeing Others Deeply and Being Deeply Seen," was written to speak to audiences of all kinds and is his attempt to repair America's torn social fabric by giving us the tools we need to move beyond division and polarization and connect with others on an innately human level.

#### **CONNECTED TO STUDENT LEARNING**

The interfaith community at Queens University fosters connection, curiosity, and growth on campus. The Belk Chapel Davies Fellowship offers experiences for students who are committed to exploring religious and spiritual life at Queens and beyond. As Belk Chapel Davies Fellows, students learn in both academic and co-curricular (outside of the classroom) settings, serve as campus leaders, engage in community outreach, and reflect together on faith-based or philosophical values that shape their lives.

Davies Fellows Maggie Dineen '25 (pictured right) and Sophie Lange '24 (pictured left) have developed a passion for interfaith work during their time at Queens and are using their fellowship with the Belk Chapel to cultivate meaningful conversation and community programming on campus. They decided to focus their research and experiential learning around Diwali and the Hindu community during the fall semester and planned a Sikh celebration on campus alongside the local Sikh community this spring.

When asked about their motivation for the project and their research, both students reflected on the learning environment at Queens.

"I am passionate about creating spaces that unite people from different backgrounds," said Dineen. "Queens does such a great job of cultivating strong student leaders. Faculty and staff empower us to use our voices and explore our interests."

Lange's interfaith involvement has shifted her perspective of international relations. "For a long time, I felt that religion had no seat at the table when it came to political discourse," said Lange. "Now, I understand how contradictory that is. You must bring yourself to the table. It is crucial that we recognize that there are so many religious, cultural, and societal factors that influence how we make decisions overall."


on the Future of Healthcare

Dr. Abraham Verghese, New York
Times bestselling author, practicing
physician and Stanford University
professor, will discuss "The Caring
in Health Care: Challenges and
Opportunities in a Technological Era"
as he shares insights into his early
career journey and the evolution of
healthcare. He will describe the crucial
role of empathy in healthcare leadership
and share how leaders can cultivate it
within themselves and their teams.

Trained in infectious diseases and pulmonary medicine, he has long been a top thinker in healthcare. His TED talk "A Doctor's Touch" has been viewed almost two million times, and is as meaningful now as the day he delivered it. During the COVID pandemic, his messages of appreciation, understanding and compassion for all in healthcare, and inspiration on how we go forward were widely appreciated. His dualpronged approach, incorporating both an appreciation of technological developments and a profound commitment to the sacred relationship between doctor/caregiver and patient, makes him a leading voice in the discussion about what quality care means now and in the future.



#### **About Abraham Verghese:**

Dr. Abraham Verghese is a bestselling author and prominent voice in *medicine* with a uniquely *humanistic* view of the future of healthcare. He received the National Humanities Medal from President Obama "for reminding us that the patient is the center of the medical enterprise." Outside of healthcare, he is best known as a phenomenally successful author. His first novel "Cutting for Stone," topped the New York Times bestseller list for over two years, it was translated into more than twenty languages, and it is being adapted for film by Anonymous Content. Amazon named it one of its 100 Books to Read in a Lifetime.

In May 2023, he published his second novel, "The Covenant of Water," debuting as a New York Times bestseller. His memoirs include the award-winning "My Own Country" and "The Tennis Partner."

#### **CONNECTED TO STUDENT LEARNING**

Recent Queens University graduate Dionisios Vrochides, M.D., Ph.D., MBA '23, is no stranger to bold career moves. A professor of surgery, serving as chief of Atrium Health's transplant oncology section and vice chair of the department of surgery since 2015, Vrochides has also been named executive director of IRCAD North America (IRCAD NA), a global hub for medical research, development and experiential surgical training.

Recognizing the critical role of business acumen in health care innovation, Vrochides enrolled in the flexible online MBA program through the McColl School of Business at Queens University. He was able to create a customized academic schedule that allowed him to continue caring for patients while furthering his education.

As the city of Charlotte undergoes massive transformation, Vrochides has also noticed a change in how students are educated today. "When I was a medical student, I was only taught about medicine. Today, institutions like Queens University and Atrium Health understand the importance of educating students and health care professionals in a holistic way, ensuring they are well-rounded and informed about other areas of the ecosystem around them." Vrochides' studies were enriched by the insights of Will Sparks, Ph.D., Dennis Thompson Distinguished Chair and Professor of Leadership at Queens University. Sparks' concept of "Actualized Leadership" emphasizes the critical role of self-awareness and stress management in maximizing leadership potential. The complex world of health care innovation requires not only strategic thinking but also the ability to lead effectively under pressure, ensuring clear decision-making and optimal outcomes for both patients and institutions.


