

What if our regrets could unlock a more fulfilling life? In this bold and inspiring talk, best-selling author Daniel Pink explores "The Surprising Path to the Good Life" — revealing how rethinking our most misunderstood emotion can sharpen decisions, boost performance, and bring deeper meaning to work and life.

Daniel Pink is the author of seven bestselling nonfiction books on a range of topics, from human motivation to the science of timing to a graphic novel career guide. His books include the New York Times bestsellers "The Power of Regret," "When," and "A Whole New Mind" as well as the #1 New York Times bestsellers "Drive" and "To Sell is Human." His deeply researched works have been translated into 46 languages and have sold more than five million copies around the world.

Over the years, he has also hosted a National Geographic television series, given one of the most popular TED talks of all time, written a regular column for the Sunday Telegraph and the Washington Post, served as chief speechwriter to Vice President Al Gore, and been a clue on Jeopardy. He lives in Washington, D.C., with his family.

A CONVERSATION WITH NITA FARAHANY & NICHOLAS THOMPSON

Artificial intelligence isn't just transforming industries—it's redefining what it means to be human. In "Al and the Future of Everything," tech journalist Nicholas Thompson and legal scholar Nita Farahany offer a rare insider's look at the breakthroughs, ethical questions, and limitless potential shaping our shared future.

Nita Farahany is an internationally acclaimed thought leader who bridges law, ethics, and technology to champion ethical progress in science and technology. Author of "The Battle for Your Brain: Defending Your Right to Think Freely in the Age of Neurotechnology," Farahany provides a much-needed map to navigate the fast-changing technological landscape of artificial intelligence and neurotechnology. A frequent media commentator and keynote speaker, she has presented at TED, the Aspen Ideas Festival, and the National Academies.

Farahany is a co-editor-in-chief of the Journal of Law and the Biosciences and is on the Board of Advisors for Scientific American. She also serves on the National Advisory Council for the National Institute for Neurological Disease and Stroke, as an elected member of the American Law Institute and on the Global Future Council on Frontier Risks for the World Economic Forum, among others.

She is the Robinson O. Everett Distinguished Professor of Law & Philosophy and Founding Director of the Duke Initiative for Science &

Society. Farahany holds degrees from Dartmouth, Harvard, and Duke, including a JD and Ph.D. in philosophy. In 2010, President Obama appointed Farahany to the Presidential Commission for the Study of Bioethical Issues, where she served for seven years.

Nicholas Thompson is the chief executive officer of The Atlantic, a position he has held since 2021. He was previously the editorin-chief of WIRED and the editor of NewYorker.com. Thompson is also a cofounder of The Atavist, a multimedia CMS that was sold to WordPress, and Speakeasy.ai, which was sold to Amplica Labs. He is a board member at ProRata.AI and The National Committee on American Foreign Policy, as well as the author of "The Hawk and the Dove: Paul Nitze, George Kennan, and the History of the Cold War." He films a daily video on tech policy for LinkedIn and has roughly 2 million followers across social media platforms. He has long been a competitive runner; in 2021, he set the American record for men 45+ in the 50K race. His second book, "The Running Ground," will be published by Random House in the fall of 2025.
