

Timely Warning (TW) & Emergency Notification (EN) Overview



- Does your institution have a policy and procedure for requiring CSAs to report crimes immediately to the reporting structure of the institution?
- Does your department or institution have a TW/EN policy and procedure?
- What information do you include in a TW/EN?
- What are the circumstances for issuing a TW/EN?
- How does your institution alert the campus community when a TW/EN is deemed appropriate?
- Who makes the decision to distribute a TW/EN?
- How do you distribute the TW/EN?

	Timely Warning (TW)	Emergency Notification (EN)
Legal Standard:	Potential ongoing or serious threat	Immediate threat to health and safety
Circumstances:	Clery-reportable crimes that have been reported (occurred in past)	Clery-reportable crimes as well as other types of emergencies (happening right now or about to happen)
Audience:	Community-wide	Can send to a segment of the community, if appropriate
When Issued:	As soon as pertinent information is available	Upon confirmation of emergency (when possible)
Follow-Up:	Not Required	Required

FINAL SUMMARY OF TW VS. EN

Crime Log



- The purpose of the Daily Crime Log is to record criminal incidents, and alleged criminal incidents, that are reported to or identified by the campus police or security department.
- Crime log entries include all crimes reported to the campus police or security department for the required geographic locations, not just *Clery Act* crimes.
- The crime log discloses specific information about criminal incidents, not crime statistics.
- The UCR Hierarchy Rule does not apply to the crime log.
 - If multiple Criminal Offenses are committed during a single incident, all of the offenses must be recorded in the log.



Internal Control Systems for Clery Statistics – Collecting, Classifying, and Counting

- Establish an institutional policy, procedure, or agreement
- Conduct an internal review of reported crimes
 - Review reports and establish audit trail
 - Reconcile statistics with preferred receivers of reports
 - Student conduct, Title IX, Human Resources, etc.
- Assess local/State jurisdictional laws and ordinances
- Send letters to LLE and request crime statistics
 - All local law enforcement and State agencies
 - Request statistics from LLE agencies with jurisdiction related to short stayaway trips and repeated use locations
- Engage CSAs with a request for crime reports (January/February and again before Commencement)
 - Send a written request to CSAs and follow-up as needed
- Management oversight and quality assurance
